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
## ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

## FACILITIES

### CHEMISTRY LAB



Chemistry laboratory provides a platform for students to nurture the budding scientist within them. This laboratory has all the necessary equipments for the preparation of samples. The laboratory has traditional equipment's including Glassware, Centrifuge, Ovens, and Distillation Unit, Electronic Weighing Machine, Bunsen Burners, Beakers and Flasks. Concealed gas line and the safety devices such as Fire fighting equipment, first-aid Kit etc. The acids and other reactive chemicals are stored in separate locked cupboards as a precautionary measure. The students are provided with separate workstations with individual burners and plug points. The apparatus includes the mortar and pestle, clay triangles, watch glasses, crucibles, crucible tongs, chemical spoon, stirring rods, filter funnels and a variety of stoppers.

### COMPUTER LAB



The Computer Lab is facilitated with a well-equipped, highly furnished fully air-conditioned, satellite connected computer labs enriched with an adequate software facility. It has Intel core i3 machines with 2.60 GHz speed, 1TB HDD; 4GB RAM with 24 hours Internet facility (4 Mbps broad band connectivity with red hat Linux server). Students and faculties can get unlimited internet access. All the systems are inter - connected through LAN and controlled by windows 2003 server with Administrator. Digital Learning Process is also available in computer lab. Both theoretical and practical sessions are too lively for the students with the best digital platform.

## **CDF LAB**



The Department of CDF is functioning under six laboratories Pattern Making and Garment Construction Lab, Fashion Sketching Lab, Draping Lab, Textile Testing and Dyeing and Printing Lab, Woven and Knitting Structure Lab Computerized Designing Lab. Our laboratory with its facility is aimed to create professional level clothes making and production skills, from beginners to advanced levels, across a range of different garments.

## **MICROBIOLOGY LAB**



The objective of Microbiology practical's is to equip the students with the usage of Microbiology media test systems and lab equipment's and to impart knowledge of the basic principles of bacteriology, virology, mycology and parasitology. Our Microbiology lab is well equipped with all basic instruments required such as Laminar Air Flow, Incubator, Hot Air Oven, Autoclave Centrifuge, pH Meter, Spectrophotometer, Microscopes, shaker cum incubator, UV-VIS spectrophotometer, Electrophoresis units and etc.,

## **LIBRARY**



Our college is endowed with a voluminous library that has a collection of 4782 books under 1833 titles. The library has the membership in e-journals like DELNET and N-List. The professors and students are highly benefitted with the enormous collection of books The computerized catalogue system helps the beneficiaries to get the substantial use of the library.

# The Placenta & it's Duties on pregnancy Time

## What is Placenta?

The placenta is an organ that develops in the uterus during pregnancy. It serves as a connection between the mother and the baby, providing nutrients, oxygen, and removing waste products from the baby's bloodstream. It also produces hormones that support pregnancy. The placenta is attached to the inner wall of the uterus and is connected to the baby via the umbilical cord. After birth, the placenta is typically delivered shortly after the baby.

## Structure of Placenta

### Maternal Side:

Composed of the decidua, which is the modified lining of the uterus during pregnancy.

Contains blood vessels that provide maternal blood to the placenta.

### Fetal Side:

Formed by the chorion, a membrane from the fetus. Contains chorionic villi, which are finger-like projections extending into the maternal blood supply for nutrient and gas exchange.

### Placental Barrier:

A semi-permeable layer between maternal and fetal blood, allowing for selective exchange of nutrients, gases, and waste products.

### Shape and Size:

Disc-shaped, about 15–25 cm in diameter and 2–3 cm thick.

### Cotyledons:

Divided into several sections called cotyledons, which house the villi and blood vessels for efficient exchange.

### Blood Flow:

Fetal blood flows through the villi, while maternal blood surrounds the villi, facilitating nutrient and gas exchange.

### Hormone Production:

Produces hormones like hCG, progesterone, and estrogen, essential for maintaining pregnancy and supporting fetal development.

## Functions of Placenta


- 1. Nutrient and Gas Exchange:** The placenta allows the exchange of nutrients (like oxygen, glucose) and waste products (such as carbon dioxide, urea) between the mother's blood and the baby's blood.
- 2. Hormone Production:** It produces essential hormones such as human chorionic gonadotropin (hCG), progesterone, and estrogen, which help maintain pregnancy and support fetal development.
- 3. Protection:** The placenta acts as a barrier to protect the fetus from harmful substances and infections. However, it is not fully impermeable.
- 4. Immunological Role:** It provides some immune protection to the fetus by transferring antibodies from the mother to the baby, offering temporary immunity after birth.
- 5. Waste Removal:** The placenta helps in removing fetal waste products such as urea and creatinine from the fetus to the mother's bloodstream, where they can be excreted.
- 6. Physical Support:** The placenta anchors the developing fetus to the uterine wall, ensuring it receives adequate nutrients and oxygen.
- 7. Blood Circulation Regulation:** It ensures proper circulation between the maternal and fetal blood, maintaining optimal flow of nutrients and oxygen while preventing direct blood mixing.



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
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
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
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
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
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
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



